


Whatever your circumstances are today, make the choice to be about God's purposes within them. See your situation as a mission from God and you'll find amazing joy in any circumstance!


something new is coming

As we get ready to move into the fall, we are excited to announce a NEW mid-week program for children called **PrimeTime!** This will occur on Wednesday evenings from 6:00pm-7:30pm and is designed for children grades Kindergarten—5th Grade. 

Take Advantage of Teachable Moments

What is your strategy for passing along your values to your teenager and for influencing your teenager to make good decisions?

The most effective strategy for parents is one that reflects a proactive approach. It is one that helps teenagers process values and decisions before they are faced with making those decisions.

One effective strategy for parents is to take advantage of "teachable moments." A "teachable moment" is any opportunity that presents itself, where you see values being presented or decisions being made. The possibility for creating teachable moments is virtually unlimited. These can appear from a television program, a news report, a movie, conversation at the dinner table, the pastor's last sermon, a book, situations happening at home, work, school, and so on.

Here are four steps to make the most of using teachable moments:

1. Identify your goal. Meaningful teachable moments rarely just happen. You can't ask your teenager: "What did you think of that movie?" and expect the question to blossom into a wonderful learning experience. You need to identify your goal. For example, what issue(s), value(s), or decision(s) do you want to discuss with your teenager that you noticed from the movie? Once you've identified the goal, then you can better facilitate a discussion that focuses on that issue, value, or decision.

2. Think ahead. When you identify a potential teachable moment, you'll need to think ahead for the types of questions you can ask that will help your teenager process the topic of the discussion, trying to move them toward some kind of personal application.

3. Be patient when kids resist. If you aren't currently having regular meaningful conversations with your teenager, be ready to face some resistance when you begin using a teachable moments strategy. Be patient. Your openness, vulnerability, and perseverance will likely begin to pay off in the long run.

4. Don't go overboard. Maintain a balance between taking advantage of teachable moments and simply living life together with your teenager. Not every conversation has to be targeted as a teachable moment. Class doesn't need to be in session 24/7. Your kids will grow weary and might even withdraw from conversations with you if they sense every moment spent together comes attached with a life lesson.

XII. Education

Christianity is the faith of enlightenment and intelligence. In Jesus Christ abide all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. All sound learning is, therefore, a part of our Christian heritage. The new birth opens all human faculties and creates a thirst for knowledge. Moreover, the cause of education in the Kingdom of Christ is co-ordinate with the causes of missions and general benevolence, and should receive along with these the liberal support of the churches. An adequate system of Christian education is necessary to a complete spiritual program for Christ's people.

In Christian education there should be a proper balance between academic freedom and academic responsibility. Freedom in any orderly relationship of human life is always limited and never absolute. The freedom of a teacher in a Christian school, college, or seminary is limited by the pre-eminence of Jesus Christ, by the authoritative nature of the Scriptures, and by the distinct purpose for which the school exists.

XIII. Stewardship

God is the source of all blessings, temporal and spiritual; all that we have and are we owe to Him. Christians have a spiritual debtorship to the whole world, a holy trusteeship in the gospel, and a binding stewardship in their possessions. They are therefore under obligation to serve Him with their time, talents, and material possessions; and should recognize all these as entrusted to them to use for the glory of God and for helping others. According to the Scriptures, Christians should contribute of their means cheerfully, regularly, systematically, proportionately, and liberally for the advancement of the Redeemer's cause on earth.





Allow me to share some statistics concerning the world and mission field that we live in:

- Only 20 percent of Americans regularly attend church. - The Barna Group
- 51 percent of U.S. adults say attending church is "not too" or "not at all" important. - The Barna Group
- Each year, more than 4,000 churches are shuttered and nearly three million American churchgoers stop attending. - New York Daily News
- A 2012 survey revealed one-fifth of the adults in the U.S. is religiously unaffiliated - the highest percentage every recorded. - The Pew Forum
- An estimated 73 million American adults are presently un-churched. When teens and children are added, the total swells to 100 million people. If the unchurched population of the United States were a nation of its own, that group would be the twelfth most populated nation on earth. - The Barna Group
- A 2012 study found that 73 percent of unchurched adults in the U.S. were never invited to church. - The Barna Group
- 82 percent of the unchurched are likely to attend church if invited by a trusted friend or relative.- Dr. Thom Rainer
- Only 2 percent of church-going people invite someone to church in a given year.- Dr. Thom Rainer
- A study including more than 15,000 adults revealed that about two-thirds are willing to receive information about a local church from a family member, and 56 percent from a friend or neighbor. The message is clear that the unchurched are open to conversations about church." - Philip Nation, LifeWay Research.
- 41 percent of the formerly churched said they would return to the local church if a friend or acquaintance invited them." - Outreach Magazine

Imagine an annual event centered on churches, involving as many as 3.5 million people at locations around the world on the same day! It's happening on September 16, 2018. The event is *National Back to Church Sunday®*, a movement that has involved over 31,000 churches worldwide.

Back to Church Sunday began in 2009 in response to survey research that indicated 82% of people said they would attend church if someone they knew invited them, but only 2% of church members were inviting people to come with them to their church.

"Every year research shows that people are willing to try church if they are invited by a friend or family member, yet very few Christians ever invite others to come to church with them," said Scott Evans, founder and CEO of Outreach, Inc. So for back to church Sunday what am I asking you to do? Very simple, I'm asking you to invite someone to be your guest.

September 9 after the PM service I will have our Connect booklets available in the Connection Center. This gives you a great opportunity to take the informational booklet to a friend, relative, or coworker and invite them to be your guest on Sunday September 16. I ask you to begin praying today about who you will invite, pray that their heart will be receptive, and pray that when they come the Lord will stir within their heart to draw them into a new or deeper relationship.
