Jim Elliot's life purpose was to reduce lostness. Jim was a missionary whose compulsion from within and command from above sent him into the jungles of Ecuador to tell the story of Jesus to the Auca Indians. At age 29, those same Indians that he went to share Jesus with, took his life.

Just before he left home for the last time, his wife asked him that if they were attacked by the Aucas, would they use their guns? Jim's response was clear and certain, "We will not use our guns." When his wife asked why, he simply said, "Because we are ready for heaven, but they are not."

In a letter to his parents dated June 23, 1947, he wrote, "Missionaries are very human folks, just doing what they are asked. Simply a bunch of nobodies trying to exalt Somebody."

That's really what it's all about. At Woodland Hills we're simply a bunch of nobodies trying to exalt Somebody and that Somebody is Jesus.

This is an example of how God works...

- A 19th century Sunday School teacher named Kimball led a shoe clerk named Moody to Jesus Christ.
- Dwight L. Moody became a famous evangelist who influenced

Frederick B. Meyer to preach on college campuses.

- Meyer led J. Wilbur Chapman to the Lord. Chapman while working with the YMCA arranged for Billy Sunday to come to Charlotte, North Carolina to attend revival meetings.

- Community leaders in Charlotte scheduled another revival with Mordecai Hamm. Under Hamm's preaching Billy Graham gave his heart to Jesus Christ.

- Billy Graham has preached to more people than any man in history.

Your Greatest Weapon Against Loneliness

If you and I are honest with ourselves, we'd have to say that at some point in our lives, we've experienced loneliness. Maybe it was after the death of a loved one. Or perhaps you've felt abandoned by a family member in your time of greatest need. This is a bleak, yet very real, situation for all of us at some point – maybe even for you today.

So where can we turn in those moments of desperation when it seems all we want is companionship? Well, the truth is the Bible has much to say on the issue of loneliness. In fact, some of the most inspiring passages in Scripture were written at times of immense and deep loneliness for the author. Take a look at what King David wrote in Psalm 69:20:

Scorn has broken my heart and has left me helpless; I looked for sympathy, but there was none, for comforters, but I found none.

Now David was a man who seemingly had everything and everyone he needed. But he very often expressed feelings of loneliness and sorrow, with no one to give him sympathy nor comfort in his time of distress. But in the midst of his pain, he held tightly to the Lord. Look what he wrote immediately after these words in verse 29: *But as for me, afflicted and in pain—may your salvation, God, protect me.* And then in verse 33, *The LORD hears the needy and does not despise his captive people.*

What comfort it is to know that though David experienced feelings of loneliness and isolation, he found solace and strength in his relationship with the Lord. He knew that though his friends might leave him in times of trouble, the Lord never would, even when his trouble was caused by his own sin!

Now you may be thinking, "Warren, that's great that God was there for David. But he was king of Israel, and I'm just a normal person." Well, when it comes to finding comfort, you have a spiritual advantage King David didn't have: the assurance as a New Testament believer of the presence of the Holy Spirit living inside of you!

So what does that mean? It means that in Christ, you have everything you need to experience comfort and peace no matter

your circumstance. In times of hardship, pain, and loneliness, you have the ultimate Comforter with you every hour of every day (John 14:16). He's the greatest weapon you have in the fight against loneliness!

Once you come to this realization, it will completely transform your life. You'll no longer see yourself as alone, but instead remember the truth that any time, day or night, you have immediate access to fellowship with God. He's with you on those lonely nights when no one's around. He's right by your side in times of deep heartache. All you have to do is talk, and He hears!

So talk to Him. The Spirit is more real than anyone or anything else in the world. Tell Him how you're feeling – and be honest. Talk about your heartbreak, your pain, and your sorrow, and He will hear you. Once you begin to experience real fellowship with the Holy Spirit, you'll find real victory in the battle against loneliness!

Summer Fun: Rediscover the Lost Arts of Family Rest and Relaxation

Most experts on the family will tell you that, "The family that prays together stays together." But I'd like to suggest a corollary to that principle, "The family that plays together stays together."

Summer is the perfect season for families to rediscover the lost arts of family rest and relaxation -- and it's also the perfect time for families to work on spending plenty of time playing together.

Here are four key reasons why parents should invest in family playtime this summer:

1. Play Builds Family Memories. At your next summer fun family gathering, eavesdrop on the conversations around you. Chances are the majority of the talk is about past family experiences.
2. Play Reduces Family Stress and Tension. Let's face it---we live in some pretty stressful times. During summer, many of us are preoccupied with escape, finding peace, and going on vacation. None of these factors are unhealthy in and of themselves. But when you add them together or experience them for a prolonged period of time, be sure to put away your work and responsibilities and take at least a week of "do-nothing-but-play" vacation time to find some perspective.
3. Play Causes Good Communication. In the routine settings of everyday life, finding the "perfect moment" to have "the big talk" with your kids can feel like an exercise in futility. But in less-structured playful summer moments, you're bound to have more opportunities to talk about "big issues" with your kids.
4. Play Produces Affirmation and Support. When our families play together, everyone gains a deeper sense of belonging, support and community. Summertime offers parents many opportunities to work at creating a strong sense of community within their family.

Families that rest, relax and play together this summer are likely to discover their time together provides a tremendous source of bonding and fun while helping kids to build a future filled with great memories. Don't let this summer pass by without investing in the serious business of family rest, relaxation and play.

Four Steps to Spice Up Your Prayer Life by Joel A. Lindsey

Let's be honest. Our prayer lives need some help! Some of us pray as if God is a cosmic genie, granting wishes and doing the bidding of those who pray the most or the best. Others treat prayer like a fire alarm-pull in case of emergency.

For those of us leading Sunday School classes, Bible studies, and small groups, prayer is often more like an administrative task to check off our to-do list rather than an encounter with a living-and listening-God. So how do we spice up our

prayer lives and get out of the repetitive rut?

Below is an acronym I learned years ago that time and again has helped me resuscitate my prayers:

- A - Adoration
- C - Confession
- T - Thanksgiving
- S - Supplication

Adoration

One of the most helpful things I've experienced in both personal and communal prayer is the power of adoration. The goal of adoration is to offer our highest compliments to God. Prayers of adoration are prayers of praise for who God is, what He's done, what He's doing, and what He will accomplish in and for His people.

An easy way to practice prayers of adoration is to simply pray Scripture back to God. Read Revelation 5:9-13. Now read the first verse and pray according to the themes addressed in it. Continue reading and praying in this manner through verse 13.

Another way to pray adoration is to make a list of God's characteristics and use each characteristic as a focus of your prayer. If leading your group in prayer, pray either of these two options out loud.

Confession

Confession is a way to recognize and clear away relational barriers between us and God. Sometimes we enter into confession of sin knowing full well the ways we aren't in line with God's commands. Other times we enter into prayer without an immediate sense of where we're sinning against God. In times like this it's helpful to recall Psalm 139:23-24: "Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my concerns. See if there is any offensive way in me; lead me in the everlasting way."

During confession, avoid vague prayers such as, "God, forgive me for being sinful." While it's true that God is able to forgive and we are sinful, the Holy Spirit convicts sinners of specific sins. Confession might look like, "God, I confess that I lied to my boss to cover up a mistake I made at work." Confession doesn't have to be limited to personal times of prayer. It is a great practice to lead your small groups through. Here are a few steps to communal confession:

Spend 2-3 minutes silently reflecting on the ways your thoughts and actions are displeasing to God. Pray Psalm 139:23-24, and invite the Spirit to point out your specific sins.

Enter into a 5-10 minute time of corporate prayer. Begin the prayer time by acknowledging the corporate sins of all people: our innate tendency to rebel against God, our pursuit of other gods (wealth, security, approval, status, etc.), and so forth. Then open the prayer time to the group. Encourage your group members to be bold in their confessions, but also to be mindful of things that may be more appropriately confessed one-on-one with a leader. Ensure your group that they can trust God is faithful to forgive them of their sins.

Close the prayer of confession by speaking aloud this pronouncement from Numbers 14:18-19, "The LORD is



slow to anger and rich in faithful love, forgiving wrongdoing and rebellion. But He will not leave the guilty unpunished, bringing the consequences of the fathers' wrongdoing on the children to the third and fourth generation. Please pardon the wrongdoing of this people, in keeping with the greatness of Your faithful love, just as You have forgiven



them from Egypt until now."

Thanksgiving

First Thessalonians 5:16-18 says, "Rejoice always! Pray constantly. Give thanks in everything, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." Prayers of thanksgiving are often reserved for times of obvious blessing—a painful relationship is mended or financial crisis averted. But the passage above reminds us that prayers of thanksgiving should be prayed in all circumstances, even when we don't understand our present difficulties and trials. A couple of tips for praying thanksgiving include:

Spend 5-10 minutes sharing things for which you are thankful, either in a journal, on a scrap piece of paper, or out loud if in a group. Include specific instances of God's blessing and faithfulness to you.

Now read Romans 8:31-39. Spend a few minutes identifying and briefly summarizing a current trial or difficult circumstance you're facing. Pray for this situation (and the situations of others, if in a group), and trust in God's infinite wisdom and goodness.

Supplication

Supplication is another way of saying, "Take your requests to God." You may feel like asking God for specific things is selfish or un-biblical. This couldn't be further from the truth. In Matthew 21:22, Jesus says to His disciples, "And if you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer." In Matthew 7:11, Jesus says, "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!"

We must balance this freedom to ask with an acknowledgment of God's perfect perspective and will. Honest prayers of supplication are always submissive to God's will and purposes. Prayers of supplication are also wonderful opportunities to pray on behalf of others. Just as the Holy Spirit intercedes for us (Romans 8:26-27), so should we pray on behalf of others.

Begin your time of supplication by praying for God to align your prayers with God's will. An appropriate prayer might sound like, "God, I acknowledge that You have a perspective on the needs of Your people that we don't have. I pray that Your Spirit would bring us into alignment with Your will so that Your desires become our desires." Take a few minutes to write down three personal prayer requests, three requests on behalf of a specific person, and three requests on behalf of a larger group of people, like the church or a nation hit by natural disaster. If you're praying with your group, take turns praying out loud through your lists.

4 Ways to Practice Missional Hospitality (Matt Chandler)



In a post-Christian world, God's people are called to operate not out of fear but out of courage. When we talk about what it means to be courageous and faithful in the age of unbelief, we have to talk about the Great Commission. That's our mission. And though it's always been true, I think it's more true than ever to say that evangelism is going to look like hospitality.

True Biblical Hospitality: Hospitality might sound unexciting or initially feel confusing. But when the Bible speaks of hospitality, it almost always ties it to aliens and strangers—people who aren't like us. Biblical hospitality means to give loving welcome to those outside your normal circle of friends. It's opening your life and your house to those who believe differently than you do.

Hospitality is all over the Bible. In fact, it's so important to God that when Paul lists out the traits necessary for a man to be qualified for the office of elder in a local congregation, we find that he must be "above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, *hospitable*, able to teach" (1 Tim. 3:2, ESV).

Now why would the Bible be so serious about hospitality? If I could just boil it down to its most simple truth, it's because God has been hospitable to us. Even when we were living as his enemies, God came and saved us. He opened the door and invited us into his presence. We demonstrate that we truly appreciate the divine hospitality we have received when we extend our own hospitality to those around us.

Four Ways to Show Hospitality

The God of the universe is serious about hospitality. Hospitality can create an entry point for living out the Great Commission and evangelizing our neighbors, especially in the age of unbelief. How do we show hospitality today? It's not complicated, though that doesn't mean it's easy.

1. Welcome Everyone You Meet: Literally, I think the best thing to do is greet everyone you see. That's an easy thing to do if you are an extrovert. That's hard if you're an introvert, and right now you're thinking, *Can we just go to number two, please?* But often the best things to do are the hardest things to do. Pray for grace, ask for strength and, well, greet people.

2. Engage People: Remember that everyone you meet is eternal. You've never met a mere mortal, and you have never met someone who doesn't bear God's image. So care about and take an interest in those you run across. I don't think this is overly difficult. It simply means we need to be asking open-ended questions and letting our inner curiosity out. You may think this is all obvious, but often we hold back from doing it. You need to get to know people, take an interest in them, and listen to them rather than just trying to think about how you can say something memorable or hilarious.

3. Make Dinner a Priority: The Bible, over and over again, talks about the joy of eating together. Long dinners with good food, good company, and good conversations that center around our beliefs, hopes, fears—that's a good dinner. Oh, and I don't mean dinner with friends. Yes, eat with your church small group, invite over your good friends, but remember that hospitality is to give loving welcome to those *outside* your normal circle of friends. It's opening your life and your house to those who believe *differently* than you do.

4. Love the Outsider: In every work environment and every neighborhood, there are people who, for whatever reason, are kind of outliers. These men and women are all around you, perhaps more so than ever in our globalized world. Because of the way



sin affects us, we tend to run away from differences and from being around people who think and look different than us. But I want to lay this before you: Jesus Christ would have moved toward those people. God extends radical hospitality to me and you. We love the outsider because we were the outsider.



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
