

6 Sins You Commit Every Time You Look at Porn

We know that pornography is an ugly and harmful sin; but it is a sin that many find themselves addicted. We know that those who indulge in porn have committed the sin of lust, but there is so much more to it than that. When you open your

browser and begin to look at those images and videos, you are sinning in ways that go far beyond lust. Here are eight sins you commit when you look at porn. **You commit the sin of idolatry.** All sin is idolatry, an attempt to find joy and satisfaction not in God himself but in what God forbids (Exodus 20:3-6). Matt Papa says it well: "An idol, simply put, is anything that is more important to you than God. It is anything that has outweighed God in your life—anything that you love, trust or obey more than God—anything that has replaced God as essential to your happiness."

You commit the sin of adultery. This is the most obvious sin you commit when you use porn. In Matthew 5, Jesus draws a clear connection between lust and adultery. "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart" (27-28)


You commit the sin of deceit. Deceit is the act of concealing or misrepresenting your actions. Because pornography generates shame, you will hide it, cover it up or refuse to confess it. When you erase your browsing history to keep your parents from finding out, when you use it in secret to keep your spouse from learning about your addiction, when you refuse to proactively confess it to an accountability partner, you are practicing deceit. And the Bible warns of the dire consequences: "No one who practices deceit shall dwell in my house; no one who utters lies shall continue before my eyes" (Psalm 101:7).

You commit the sin of greed. Sexual sin is greed, a form of taking advantage of another person to defraud them of something that is rightly theirs. In 1 Thessalonians 4, Paul insists "that no one transgress and wrong his brother in this matter [of sexual sin], because the Lord is an avenger in all these things, as we told you beforehand and solemnly warned you" (6). The word translated "wrong" in this context refers to greedily taking something from someone else. It is to allow greed to motivate fraud, to unfairly and illegitimately use another person for your ignoble purposes.

You commit the sin of sloth. We are called in all of life to "redeem the time," to understand that we live short little lives and are responsible before God to make the most of every moment (Ephesians 5:16). Sloth is laziness, an unwillingness to use time well, and reflects a willingness to use time for destructive instead of constructive purposes. In that way pornography using precious moments, to harm others instead of help them, to foster sin instead of kill sin, to backslide instead of grow, to pursue an idol instead of the living God.

You commit the sin of ignoring the Holy Spirit. As a Christian, you have the tremendous honor and advantage of being indwelt by the Holy Spirit. One of the ways the Spirit ministers to you is in giving you an internal warning against sin. Paul assures that the Spirit warns against sexual sin in particular, then provides a stern caution: "Therefore whoever disregards this [warning], disregards not man but God, who gives his Holy Spirit to you" (1 Thessalonians 4:8). To commit sexual sin is to ignore the Holy Spirit, to actively suppress his voice as he warns that you need not and should not commit this sin.

It is sinful to lust after another person and to enable this lust through pornography. Yet the sin bound up in pornography goes far deeper than mere lust. It extends to **idolatry, adultery, deceit, greed, sloth, and ignoring the Holy Spirit.** Romans 14:12 warns: "So then each of us will give an account of himself to God."

Creating a Media-Safe Home

For better or worse, media has a powerful influence in our kids' lives! Today's media sends nonstop communication, delivering its voice through television, movies, Internet, music, magazines, books, computers, smartphones, tablets, and more. Frankly, it is impossible for parents to have control over every message that is being sent to our kids.

Because parents can't control all of their kids' media consumption, some feel lost, hopeless, or paralyzed when facing today's technology and media. We may complain, but it is time for us to quit whining, and do something. Don't give up. Don't bail out. There are things we can do and environments we can foster to create a media-safe home.

Watch, Listen, and Read. Creating a media-safe home requires that you become a student of the culture. The easiest way to get a handle on what media your kids are consuming is to watch what they watch, listen to what they listen to, and read what they read. Look for every opportunity to ask and learn from your kids.

Evaluate. Evaluate everything you see and hear with your kids. When you evaluate, don't just play the bad-guy role. At times, this will likely be necessary, but also tell your kids what you like and why, and help them learn to discern what they are putting into their minds.

Examine Your Own Behavior. Too many parents want their kids to make good media choices but aren't willing to discipline themselves. Remember the old adage: Children see, children do. Set the example you want your kids to follow.

Discuss and Listen; Don't Lecture. Anytime we can truly dialog with our kids about media use and influence, it is better than any lecture or sermon we could ever deliver to them. Ultimately, you may choose to disagree with your kids' opinions but they will at least feel you were willing to listen.

Develop Clear Expectations. Work together with your teens to come up with clearly expressed expectations about media consumption and use of the devices that deliver media. As technology changes rapidly, you'll need to revisit the expectations from time to time to keep them relevant and current.



Six Reasons People Quit Coming to Church

For a time, I was not interested in coming to church. The Sunday tradition had grown monotonous, and I wasn't getting anything out of it anymore — despite the fact that I came every week and even served. The excuse "I'll watch online" or "I'll do my own church by reading the Bible at my kitchen table" became acceptable. But I never did either of those things.

This is not what church was intended to be.

Those months when I stopped attending, I became aware of a couple things.

One, without my church community I had no accountability for serving or being involved.

Two, I felt distant from God. This was evident by how my personality changed. I was quick to anger, less patient, and unkind. Something needed to change. I studied my heart for the real reason I'd stopped coming and came up with a few reasons why people stop attending church along with what Scripture has to say about each of them.

6 Reasons People Stop Coming to Church...



1. SHAME

Maybe you have messed up or are currently caught in some kind of habitual sin. James 5:13-16 says, "...prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

The best place to overcome sin is inside the church, not outside of it. In the church, you'll find people who have been freed from the same struggle you're facing and can support you as you let Jesus change you from the inside out.

2. LEADERSHIP DISAGREEMENTS

There is no such thing as a perfect church. At some point, every one of us will disagree with someone or something the church is doing. While we should not follow blindly to man instead of God, we can respectfully come to an understanding based on God's truth. 1 Thessalonians 5:12 says, "Honor those who are your leaders in the Lord's work. They work hard among you and give you spiritual guidance."

3. FRUSTRATION

Big or small church, when it feels like no one is reaching out or no one cares, you're left feeling like, "What's the point?" Maybe you feel like another lost face in the crowd, or maybe you have not found the right place to get involved. Don't give up. Because when we find our place in church, we discover what God has called us to do.

Romans 15:1-7 says, "May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."

4. LIFE CHANGES

A new job or even becoming a new parent can get you out of the habit of attending. Pretty soon, you stop coming altogether.

Hebrews 10:24 cautions against this, saying, "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

5. A WRONG VIEW OF WHAT CHURCH IS SUPPOSED TO BE

When your mindset becomes "What can the church do for me?" instead of "What can I bring to the church?", your motive becomes one of selfishness rather than selflessness. We each have unique gifts the Lord intended for us to use for His glory.

1 Corinthians 12:4-12 says, "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. 6 There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work...Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ."


There will never be a time God calls you away from church or a time you will not need church.

6. SPOUSES WITH DIFFERENT DENOMINATIONAL BACKGROUNDS OR SPOUSES WHO DO NOT WANT TO COME

Our spouses are our helpers and encouragers. When one's faith is wavering, the other can lead by example.

1 Peter 3:1-7 says, "Wives, in the same way submit yourselves to your own husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives, when they see the purity and reverence of your lives... Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect as the weaker partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, so that nothing will hinder your prayers."

Church, as well as church community, is an important part of our spiritual growth during every season of life. There will never be a time when God calls you away from church or a time you will not need the church.
