Herb Reavis, Jr. has been the pastor of North Jacksonville Baptist Church since September of 1991. He is a graduate of Moody Bible Institute of Chicago, Milligan College in Tennessee, and the Southern Baptist School for

Biblical Studies in Jacksonville, Florida. Pastor Reavis is seen throughout North Florida and Southeast Georgia on the weekly broadcasts of "Reach Out". He is also heard daily on the "Reach Out" radio program broadcast on WROS in Jacksonville. Pastor Reavis and his wife Lisa have three sons, Joshua, Jonathan, and Joseph. Jonathan and Rebecca were married in June 2005 and shortly after, in February 2006, Joshua and Sarah were married. Pastor Reavis and Lisa are now proud grandparents.

Bob Pitman

Bob Pitman began preaching at age sixteen and has been preaching for fifty-nine years. For thirty-three years he served as a Senior Pastor in churches affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention (Wall Highway)

Baptist Church, Madison, AL, three years; First Baptist Church, Muscle Shoals, AL, eleven years; Kirby Woods Baptist Church, Memphis, TN, nineteen years).

He is a native of Florence, AL. He is also a graduate of Samford University in Birmingham, AL (B.A. degree, 1970), and Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary in Memphis, TN (M.Div. degree, 1977; Ph.D. degree, 2004).

He has preached over 1,000 revival meetings and Bible conferences in the USA and has also preached in several conferences in Europe and Africa and he is an author of four books.

Jim Moss

Evangelist Jim W. Moss was born in Pine Bluff, Arkansas and called to preach at the age of 14. As a teenager, he preached 77 revivals in various states. At the age of 18, he became pastor of the Macedonia Baptist Church

in Humnoke, Arkansas. In 1978 and 1979, Macedonia was the fastest growing church in Arkansas with over 250 baptisms recorded. God moved him to Shelbyville, Texas in 1981, where he pastored the Ephesus Baptist Church until the year 1990. Then he became pastor of First Baptist Church located in San Augustine, Texas for the next 10 years. Both churches received recognition for the largest percentage Sunday School growth and twenty percent baptism increase. In 2000, Brother Moss surrendered to the call of evangelism.

Joseph Adams

Joseph Adams is the pastor of First Baptist Church in Hughes Springs. He has been Pastor there for seven years. He has led the church to become an evangelistic, missionfocused congregation. Under his leadership

Mission giving has gone from 2% to 10%. The church is regularly reaching people and seeing them baptized. Seven years ago, FBC Hughes Springs had about 60 in attendance; today they average nearly 500 per Sunday.

Joseph served five years on Texas Baptists' Missions Funding Council, and is currently the Second Vice President of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

He earned both his undergraduate degree and his Master of Leadership in Biblical Counseling degree from Liberty University. Joseph and his wife Lindsay have five children—Elliott, Noah, Emma, Parker and Walker. Lindsay serves as the First Grade Teacher at Woodland Hills Christian Academy.

Herman Cramer

At the young age of 28, Herman Cramer was considered successful by the Worlds' standards. After graduating from High School, Herman began farming the rich and fertile ground of the Rio Grande Valley of Texas. After

acquiring 3000 acres of farm land Herman had the World in his hands. Herman experienced a harvest like no other, his own life. Herman experienced a personal call to the Gospel ministry one year after his dramatic salvation experience. Herman makes his home in Seguin, Texas were he is a member of the First Baptist Church.. Herman was married to Judell for 57 years before she passed away on March 17, 2019. Herman is a graduate of the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Ft. Worth, Texas. Prior to becoming the founding and organizing pastor of the Lighthouse Missionary Baptist Church of Franklin, New Iberia, and Abbeville, LA. As a young minister of the gospel, not long after accepting and announcing his call into the ministry in 1995, he attended the College of Biblical Studies in Houston, TX.
